87[™] LEGISLATIVE SESSION: IN REVIEW



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
One group stands at the Capitol for consumers and our courts. This session was one of the most challenging in our history, but we adapted and overcame, impacting the political process in new ways. We mounted aggressive campaigns on road safety, insurance reform, and patient safety. Our well-funded opponents coordinated a frontal assault on Texans' 7th Amendment rights, threatening those maimed or killed by commercial vehicles and attempting to make it more difficult to recover medical damages. Between the pandemic and fallout from the winter storms, we knew we faced a tumultuous session and prepared accordingly, investing in cutting-edge digital advocacy tools.


We succeeded in engaging more Texans than ever before in the fight for their constitutional right to trial by jury. **11,868 Texans emailed, called, or tweeted** at their lawmakers through our website, more than doubling the amount from last session.

44

We **produced 44 videos** this session, educating the public and lawmakers on key consumer- and court-related bills moving through the legislature. Our videos were viewed over 950,400 times.

Across all our platforms, we reached **14.5 million people**, 9 times more than 2019. For every \$1 we spent, we reached 316 people through targeted campaigns.





HARD-HITTING ADVOCACY ON 50 BILLS

#SafeRoads

HB 19 was pushed hard by commercial vehicle lobbyists, TLR, and many corporations and chambers from across the state. We opposed this heavily-funded effort with everything we had because Texas leads the nation in commercial vehiclerelated deaths, and the bill only makes our roads more dangerous. Texas Watch helped dozens of families tell their stories about how commercial vehicle crashes impacted their lives, making the dangers on our roads real for legislators.

#PatientSafety

SB 207 and HB 1617 were packaged with HB 19 and brought by the same special interests. These bills threatened the ability of Texans to recover their full medical damages in court. We joined many doctors in raising our opposition because of the impact these bills would have on patients' rights.

Other Campaigns

With the support of our activists, important progress was made on HB 359 (UM/UIM benefits), HB 2534 (appraisal fairness), HB 1131 (quality auto repairs), HB 1793 (stopping "swoop and settle"), and HB 3957 (veterans health). We look forward to building on this progress next session.


