SUPREME COURT APPOINTMENT PROCESS



1. Supreme Court vacancy occurs.



2. The President consults with their advisors and creates a list of potential candidates.



3. The President announces their nomination and formally submits the nomination to the Senate.



4. Nomination is referred to the Senate Judiciary Committee.



5. The Senate Judiciary Committee holds public hearings about the nominee.



6. The Senate
Judiciary Committee
votes to determine
what recommendation
to report to the full
Senate.



7. The full Senate debates the nomination.



8. The full Senate votes to confirm the nomination.



9. The nominee is appointed to the Supreme Court and sworn into office.
